


2016 PRONGHORN HUNTING UNITS



The north border of Unit 3-A begins where the Little Missouri River first touches the northernmost Slope County line, thence westerly along and to the end of the northernmost Slope County line, thence due west along a straight line to the Montana border.

PRONGHORN BOW SEASON (Bows Only) – September 2 (noon) through September 25, 2016.
PRONGHORN GUN SEASON (Legal Firearms or Bows) – September 30 (noon) through October 16, 2016.

We must deduct gratis licenses from the total available to determine the number left for the public lottery. If the number of gratis applications for any unit exceeds the number of licenses prescribed by the governor's proclamation, the gratis licenses will also be issued by lottery. Do not submit both a gratis and a lottery application for your pronghorn license.

RESTRICTIONS ON THE GRATIS LICENSE:

- Gratis licenses are available to North Dakota residents owning, or leasing **for agricultural purposes and actively farming or ranching**, at least 150 acres of land located in an open hunting unit (leased ND School Trust Land is eligible, other leased State or Federal Government Land is not eligible).
- The gratis license is valid only upon land described on the application and subsequently the license.
- The gratis license is valid during the pronghorn bow and gun seasons until filled.
- The eligibility may be transferred to a spouse or legal dependent who has resided with the landowner for the previous six months.
- If not otherwise specified in an agricultural lease, the landowner is entitled to receive the gratis license.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER REQUIREMENT. In accordance with state law NDCC 20.1-03-35 and 42 US Code 666 (a) (13) and (16), the Department is required to collect social security numbers from all persons obtaining hunting, fishing, or other recreational type licenses. Your social security number serves as your principal identification number to determine license eligibility. It is kept confidential, however it may be provided to law enforcement agencies and the State Disbursement Unit to enforce child support obligations.

In accordance with state law (NDCC 20.1-02-05), a resident who is 18 years of age or older must submit a ND drivers license number or a ND nondriver photo ID number when applying for a license.

The NDGFD receives federal financial assistance from the US Fish and Wildlife Service. In accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, the NDGFD joins the US Department of the Interior and its Bureaus in prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, disability, sex (in education programs or activities) and also religion for the NDGFD.
