


Applications must be postmarked no later than August 3, 2016. Please note that some post offices use the following days postmark if mailed after regular hours. Mail your application early to ensure a proper postmark. Private metered postmarks will not be accepted.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER REQUIREMENT. In accordance with state law NDCC 20.1-03-35 and 42 US Code 666 (a) (13) and (16), the Department is required to collect social security numbers from all persons obtaining hunting, fishing, or other recreational type licenses. Your social security number serves as your principal identification number to determine license eligibility. It is kept confidential, however it may be provided to law enforcement agencies and the State Disbursement Unit to enforce child support obligations.

 In accordance with state law (NDCC 20.1-02-05), a resident who is 18 years of age or older must submit a ND drivers license number or a ND nondriver photo ID number when applying for a license.



The north border of Unit 3-A begins where the Little Missouri River first touches the northernmost Slope County line, thence westerly along and to the end of the northernmost Slope County line, thence due west along a straight line to the Montana border.

PRONGHORN GUN SEASON (Legal Firearms or Bows) — September 30 (noon) through October 16, 2016.

License holders are restricted to their unit. License holders may hunt during both the bow season (bows only) and the gun season (legal firearms or bows) until license is filled.
