


2016 YOUTH DEER SEASON



SOUTH DAKOTA

- **RESTRICTED YOUTH ANTLERED MULE DEER LICENSES:** If your intent is to hunt antlered mule deer and you wish to apply in units 3B1, 3B2, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D, 4E or 4F (see restricted units on map above), **licenses will be issued by lottery** and the application deadline is June 1, 2016. Please indicate your hunting unit choice in the box on the front side, to the right of section 2. Available *any deer* (except antlerless mule deer in units 4A, 4B and 4C) licenses are listed at right. These **licenses are valid only for the specific unit and hunters must hunt only in that unit** during the youth season (Sept 16 - Sept 25) or, if unsuccessful, the regular gun season (Nov 4 - Nov 20).

NOTE: If you apply for one of these restricted licenses and are unsuccessful, you will automatically be issued a regular youth deer license.

- **REGULAR YOUTH DEER LICENSES:** If not applying in the restricted units listed above, licenses are **not limited** and are **valid statewide** for *any deer* (except antlered mule deer in units 3B1, 3B2, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D, 4E and 4F; and antlerless mule deer in units 4A, 4B and 4C). There is no need to indicate a hunting unit choice in the box on the front side and the application deadline is September 1, 2016.

For 2016, no hunter may take antlerless mule deer in hunting units 4A, 4B and 4C!

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Youth Deer Season. Resident first time deer gun hunters ages 13 (providing the youth will be age 14 on or before December 31 of this year), 14, and 15 who have never received a deer gun license (exception: individuals who received a special antlerless white-tailed deer license when they were age 12 and/or age 13 are also eligible) are eligible to apply for a **once-in-a-lifetime** youth deer license valid for the youth deer season to be held prior to the regular deer gun season. If the licensee is unsuccessful in harvesting a deer during the youth deer season, the license will also be valid during the regular deer gun season. Anyone applying for these licenses may not apply for a regular deer gun season license.

All regulations in effect for the regular deer gun season will apply during the youth deer season.

Each youth licensee must be accompanied by at least one unarmed parent, guardian, or adult authorized by their parent or guardian. No licensee hunting in the field during the youth deer season may be accompanied by a nonlicensee carrying a firearm or bow and arrow. A nonlicensee is a person not having a youth deer season license.

Arrowwood, Chase Lake, Des Lacs, J. Clark Salyer, Long Lake, Lostwood, Lake Alice, Sibley Lake, Slade, Tewaukon, Lake Nettie, Lake Zahl, and Upper Souris National Wildlife Refuges are open to the youth deer season. Youth hunters are required to contact refuge headquarters prior to hunting, for permission and information concerning access, areas closed for safety, or other conditions.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER REQUIREMENT. In accordance with state law NDCC 20.1-03-35 and 42 US Code 666 (a) (13) and (16), the Department is required to collect social security numbers from all persons obtaining hunting, fishing, or other recreational type licenses. Your social security number serves as your principal identification number to determine license eligibility. It is kept confidential, however it may be provided to law enforcement agencies and the State Disbursement Unit to enforce child support obligations.

The NDGFD receives federal financial assistance from the US Fish and Wildlife Service. In accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, the NDGFD joins the US Department of the Interior and its Bureaus in prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, disability, sex (in education programs or activities) and also religion for the NDGFD.
