**BAG LIMIT: One Tundra Swan**

**TENTATIVE SEASON INFORMATION:**

TUNDRA SWANS may be taken statewide from October 1 through January 1, 2017. A total of 2,200 licenses will be issued through a lottery. Successful applicants will be issued a tag to take one swan during the season. The Department will accept lottery applications through August 17. A person may submit only one application. North Dakota residents and nonresidents shall be eligible to apply. Non-toxic shot is required for swan hunting. Since swans are waterfowl, nonresidents may hunt them only during the period that their nonresident waterfowl license is valid and must stay within selected zones (exception – statewide license).

**INSTRUCTIONS:** (If you need any assistance in filling out this application, contact the N.D. Game & Fish Department.)

- ELIGIBILITY:** Make sure you meet all the eligibility requirements listed in section 5. Only one application per person may be submitted for the tundra swan season. There are no provisions for applicants to apply as a party. Fill out all required information in section 6, "Applicant Information." In accordance with state and federal laws, you must include your social security number, and if a resident 18 years of age or older you must include your ND drivers license number or ND nondriver photo ID number. Your social security number serves as an identification number in the weighted lottery. If any part of the application or fees is incomplete or in error, the application will not be processed and will be returned to sender.
- HUNTER EDUCATION: ATTENTION!** If you were born after December 31, 1961, you must fill in your hunter education certificate number, and the state or province in which you received it. Required hunter education certification must be completed prior to application being submitted. **ATTENTION: Compliance is enforced by verification with state enforcement agencies. If your certificate is unnumbered, write 'NONE' and the year and state in which you were certified. If you have a change in last name since completing the course, attach a note to the application. Individuals qualifying for a one year apprentice hunter validation should visit our website at gf.nd.gov for more details.**
- SIGNATURES:** Read carefully the "AS AN APPLICANT I CERTIFY THAT" portion of the form (section 5), then sign and date.
- FEE:** The fee is \$10.00 for residents and \$30.00 for nonresidents. Other licenses required: **Residents** regardless of age must also possess a \$1.00 fishing, hunting and furbearer certificate and a general game and habitat license (\$20.00). In addition, hunters 16 years of age and older must possess a small game license (\$10.00) or a combination license (\$50.00) before hunting swans. **Nonresidents** of all ages are required to possess fishing, hunting and furbearer certificates, general game and habitat licenses, and state waterfowl licenses before hunting swans. Should you receive a swan license in the lottery drawing, these licenses can be purchased from the Department, any license vendor, by calling toll free 1-800-406-6409, or via our website at gf.nd.gov. In addition, all swan hunters must be ND HIP certified and all hunters 16 years of age or older must possess a federal duck stamp.

IN PARTY

Do not send cash. Personal checks, cashier's checks or money orders are acceptable. A separate check or money order is required for each application. Make payable to N.D. Game and Fish Department. Unsuccessful applicants will receive a refund. Insufficient funds checks will be turned over to a collection agency and be subject to additional costs. If money is not collected, the applicant will be ineligible for both the current year and the following year.

**5. AS AN APPLICANT, I CERTIFY THAT:**

- ... This is the only application being made in my name for a 2016 tundra swan license;
- ... If applying as a resident, I have actually lived in the state of North Dakota or maintained my residence therein for the past six months;
- ... I am aware of the hunter education course requirement for persons born after December 31, 1961, and have passed the course of instruction or am exempt by law. (Note: persons under 12 years of age may hunt if they have appropriate licenses and are accompanied by parent or guardian).
